**SUBJECT:** Civil War Battlefield Preservation

#### The Subject:

Harpers Ferry National Historical Park (HFNHP) was established on June 28, 1944, originally as a national monument. During the last 65 years, the park has expanded in size and scope to preserve and interpret themes relating to the 1859 John Brown Raid, the American Civil War, industrial history, transportation development, African American history, Native American history, and the environment. Currently, HFNHP is preparing to commemorate the Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War, commencing with the 150th Anniversary of John Brown's Raid on October 16-18, 2009. Major public events are scheduled over the next six years. HFNHP is also pursuing preservation projects to preserve specific historical sites in and around the

current Park boundary. Scot Faulkner, President of Friends of HFNHP, will discuss these projects and the Sesquicentennial.

## The Speakers:

Since its inception in 2004, **Edward Dunleavy** has been President of the Shepherdstown Battlefield Preservation Association Inc. Please visit our website at: [www.battleofshepherdstown.org](http://www.battleofshepherdstown.org) He is a Board member and Treasurer of the Historic Shepherdstown Commission. He is past Treasurer and Secretary of the Shepherdstown Men's Club. Presently, Ed is a Jefferson County Planning Commissioner.

Prior to his move to Shepherdstown, Ed spent 32 years on Wall Street. Most recently he was Executive Vice President, Director of Equity Division, and a Member of the Board of Directors of Gruntal & Co. LLC in New York. Prior to that, he was Executive Vice President, Director of Equity Capital Markets, and a Member of the Board of Directors of EVEREN Securities in Chicago.

Ed began his career in 1969 as a securities analyst working at Merrill Lynch for 11 years and Salomon Brothers for 5 years. He became Director of European Equity Research at Salomon Brothers Int'l in London in 1986. As a securities analyst, he was a member of the Institutional Investor magazine All Star Team, from 1976-1986

Ed served in the U.S. Army from 1966-1969 and was an Infantry Platoon Leader and Company Executive Officer in Vietnam (1968) and was awarded Bronze Star for Valor with Oak Leaf Cluster.

Ed obtained a BA and MBA from Rutgers University.

*Friends of Harpers Ferry National Historical Park is the official community liaison between Harpers Ferry National Historical Park and the surrounding communities. Scot Faulkner, and former Harpers Ferry Mayor Bradley Nash, co-founded Friends of HFNHP in March 1988.*

*Together, they built a highly successful community-based organization that has preserved over 1,800 acres of historic and scenic land in the Harpers Ferry area and supported numerous park programs. In 1994, Friends of HFNHP received the Partnership Award from the Department of Interior for its role in supporting the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Park.*

*In 2001, West Virginia Governor Wise recognized Friends of HFNHP for its role in fostering local economic development in helping found Harpers Ferry Main Street. The group received its second Partnership Award in 2006 for its role in passage of Public Law 108-307, the expansion of the Park's boundary.*

*Scot Faulkner is the author of the critically acclaimed bestseller, "Naked Emperors: The Failure of the Republican Revolution". He advises numerous corporations on strategic change and leadership. He also works with governments and corporations in emerging economies, including Afghanistan, China, Dubai, Egypt, Iraq, Qatar, Tanzania, and Togo. His articles on leadership, management reform, and global competitiveness are published in The New York Times, The Washington Times, and various business publications. He has appeared on Bloomberg, CBS News, CNN, CSPAN, FOX, NPR, PBS, VOA, and numerous talk radio programs.*

In 1995, Scot Faulkner was elected the first Chief Administrative Officer of the U.S. House of Representatives. He oversaw a \$1 billion annual budget and all non-legislative operations, which served 14,000 employees and 3 million tourists. His business-based reforms rebuilt the integrity of House operations and saved over \$148 million. His reforms became a model for the operation of 44 national parliaments around the world and were named one of the Top 100 Innovations in American Government by the Ford Foundation and Harvard University.

Mr. Faulkner was the National Director of Personnel for the Reagan Bush Campaign of 1980. He went on to serve in the Presidential Transition and on the White House Staff. During the Reagan Administration, Mr. Faulkner held executive positions at the Federal Aviation Administration, the General Services Administration, and the Peace Corps. His accomplishments have been recognized with 26 management awards and four letters of commendation from the President of the United States.

Mr. Faulkner earned a Masters Degree in Public Administration from American University and a Bachelors Degree in Government from Lawrence University. He studied at the London School of Economics and at Georgetown University. Mr. Faulkner has served as adjunct faculty at the Robert H. Smith School of Business at the University of Maryland and lectured at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. He also serves on the boards of numerous corporations and foundations.
